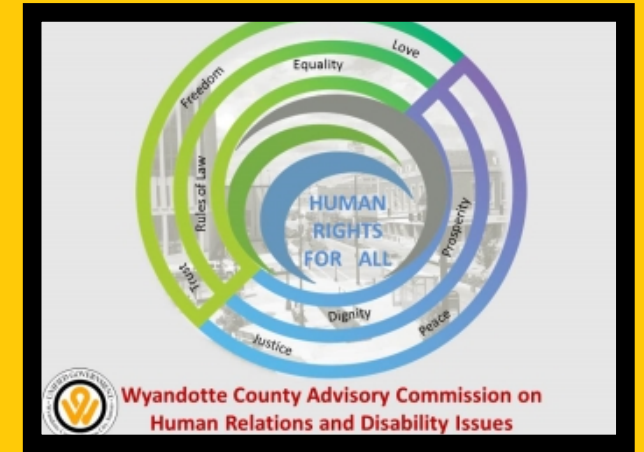

2018 Metro Area Human Relations Summit

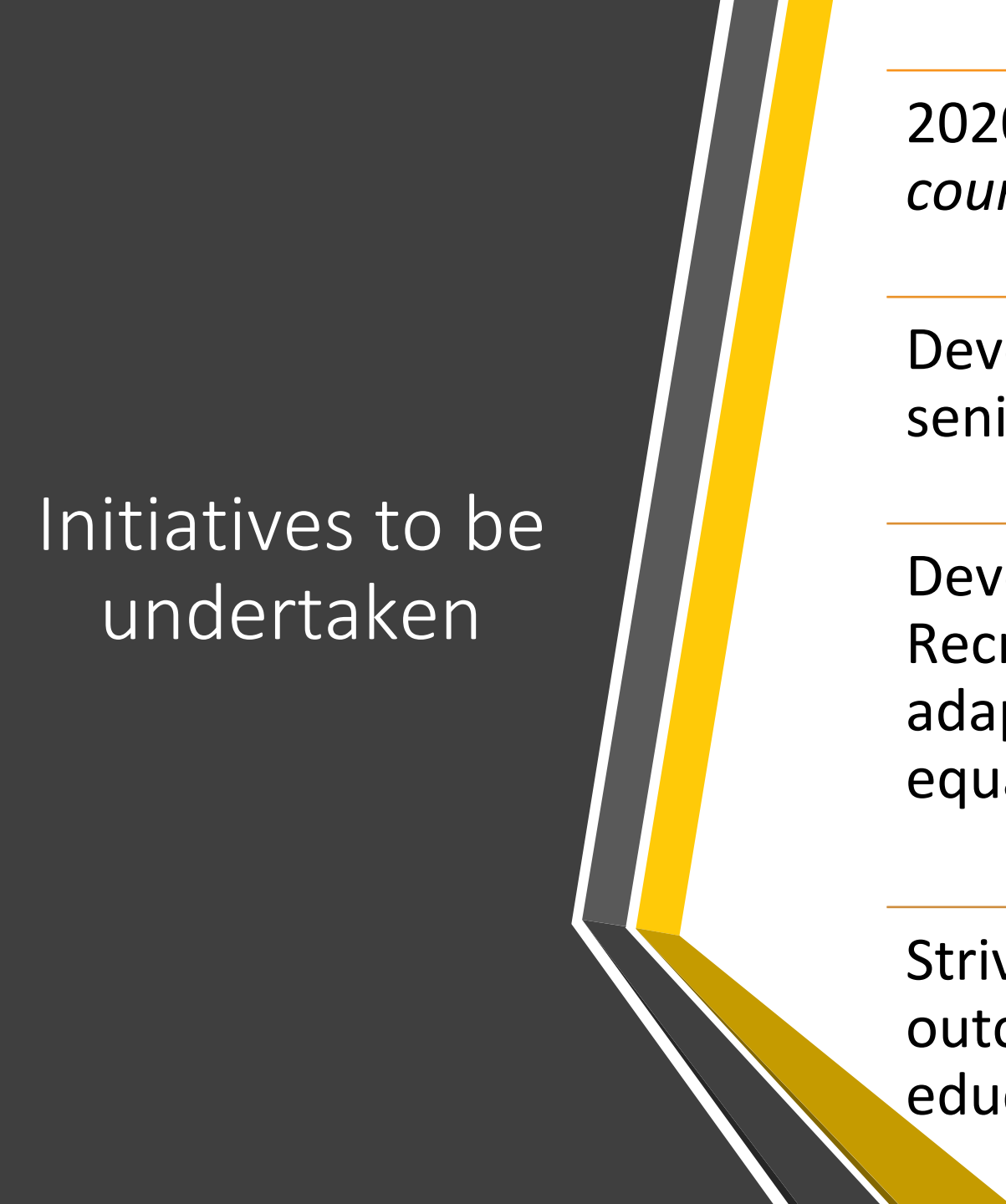

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE relating to Chapter 18, Human Relations, amending Section 18-23 of the Unified Government Code.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE UNIFIED GOVERNMENT OF WYANDOTTE COUNTY/KANSAS CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1. That Chapter 18, Human Relations, Section 18-23, of the Code of Ordinances for the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas, be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18-23. - Purposes.

The purposes of the commission on human relations and disabilities issues shall be to provide, foster, encourage and stimulate mutual understanding, respect and harmonious relations among all races, religious groups, all sexual orientations and genders, ethnic and minority groups, and people with disabilities, to discourage and prevent prejudice, intolerance, bigotry, disorder and discriminating practices against any group or its members, to function as the advisory committee on disabilities issues in order to identify necessary services not being provided for people with disabilities and to improve the delivery of services for disabled persons in the most cost effective manner, to promote good will, to develop a program for practical cooperation with state and federal agencies and nongovernmental agencies having the like or kindred function, and to make such investigation and studies in any field of human relations as may be required by the commission, or in judgment of the commission, will aid in effectuating its general purposes.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval and publication in the publication of record for the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE relating to Chapter 18, Human Relations, amending Section 18-25 of the Unified Government Code.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE UNIFIED GOVERNMENT OF WYANDOTTE COUNTY/KANSAS CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1. That Chapter 18, Human Relations, Section 18-25, of the Code of Ordinances for the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas, be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18-25. - Meetings.

- (a) The commission on human relations and disabilities issues shall hold a regular meeting at least once each month at such time and place as shall be fixed by said commission in its standing rules. Special meetings shall be called by the chairperson or, in the chairperson's absence, by the vice-chairperson, upon written request of the same number of commission members needed for a quorum.
- (b) A simple majority of the filled positions on the commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Action shall be taken by the advisory commission upon a vote of a majority of the members present, unless in any case the bylaws of the advisory commission require a larger number.
- (c) The commission shall adopt rules for the transaction of business and keep a record of its activities and minutes of all meetings.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval and publication in the publication of record for the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas.
