AN ORDINANCE

& RESOLUTION relating to Chapter 2, Administration, amending Sections 2-52, 2-57, and 2-141 of the Unified Government Code, and repealing original Sections 2-52, 2-57, and 2-141.

WHEREAS, in 2015 the Kansas Legislature passed legislation changing the dates of local elections from April to November; and

WHEREAS, the legislation requires the Governing Body of the municipality to establish by ordinance or resolution terms of office of elected officials to comply with this act; and

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 25-21a01 establishes terms for members of governing bodies and other elected officials of any municipality; and

WHEREAS, in 2019 the Kansas Legislature passed SB 105 which authorized municipalities to begin the terms of its city officers as early as December 1 after the certification of the general election; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance and resolution sets the beginning of the terms of office for city officers as the Monday before the second unified board of commissioners meeting in December after a biennial unified government election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE UNIFIED GOVERNMENT OF WYANDOTTE COUNTY/KANSAS CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1. That Section 2-52 of the Code of the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas, be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-52. - Elections and terms.

(a) After January 1, 2017, the nonpartisan primary election for mayor and commission members shall be held on the first Tuesday in August of every odd number year commencing in 2017. The general election shall be held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday in November of odd numbered years, both elections to be conducted in the manner prescribed in this division and Kansas law applicable to elections of first class cities to the extent such law does not conflict

with unified government ordinances or resolutions. In 2017, and in each subsequent year in which the term of the mayor or commission member expires, and if there are more than two candidates who have filed for any position, a primary election shall be held for the nomination of two candidates for that position. Each qualified elector of Wyandotte County in the primary election for mayor and each qualified elector of the expiring commission member's at-large district or district commission member shall be entitled to vote for one candidate from among the candidates seeking election to the position. The two candidates receiving the greatest number of votes shall be placed on the general election ballot as the candidates nominated for election as mayor, district member or at-large commission member.

(b) In the general election all qualified electors of the county shall be entitled to vote in the nonpartisan election of the mayor. Between the two candidates nominated for the office of mayor, the candidate receiving the highest number of votes in the general election shall be elected as mayor. As of January 1, 2017, the election for the office of mayor shall be held every four years on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday of November. The term of the mayor shall expire on the ~~second Monday of January following an election~~ Monday before the second commission meeting in December after a biennial unified government election, when the newly elected mayor shall take office.

(c) In the general unified government election all qualified electors of each district shall be entitled to vote in the nonpartisan election of the district commission member from the district where said elector resides. Between the two candidates nominated from each district, the candidate receiving the highest number of votes in the general election shall be elected as the commission member from the district. The term of the district commission members subject to election shall expire on the ~~second Monday of January following a November election~~ Monday before the second commission meeting in December after a biennial unified government election, when the newly elected commission members shall take office.

(d) All qualified electors of the county shall be entitled to vote in the nonpartisan general election of both at-large members. Between the two candidates nominated from each at-large district, the candidate receiving the highest number of votes in the general election shall be elected as the at-large commission member from the at-large district. The term of the at-large commission member shall expire on the ~~second Monday of January following a November election~~ Monday before the second commission meeting in December after a biennial unified government election, when the newly elected at-large commission member shall take office.

(e) In the election held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday of November 2017, the following positions of district commissioner shall be subject to election: At-Large District 2; District 1; District 5; District 7; and District 8. In the election held on the Tuesday succeeding the first Monday of November 2019, the following districts shall be subject to election: At-Large District 1; District 2; District 3; District 4; and District 6.

(f) Except as otherwise provided by law, the election commissioner shall cause notice of the time of the holding of any general election to be published once at least 15 days before such election, except in the case of special elections, when ten days' notice shall be given. Such notice shall be published in the official unified government newspaper. Such notice shall state the date and

times of such election, the name of each person nominated for any public office to be voted upon, and any propositions to be voted upon. If such election is not held in conjunction with another election for which notice of voting areas and polling places has been published, the notice required by this section shall also include such information.

Section 2. That Section 2-57 of the Code of the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas, be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-57. - Schedule of meetings.

At its ~~first~~ second meeting in ~~January in each year~~ December after a biennial unified government election, the commission shall establish by resolution a regular schedule of meeting times and dates for the next two years. The schedules shall provide for no fewer than two commission meetings each month.

Section 3. That Section 2-141 of the Code of the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas, be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-141. - Nomination of candidates for the offices of sheriff and register of deeds, terms.

- (a) In order for their names to appear on the ballot for the fall local nonpartisan elections, candidates for the offices of sheriff and register of deeds must qualify to become candidates by one of the following methods:
 - (1) A nomination petition signed by 1,400 qualified electors of the unified government;
or
 - (2) A declaration of intention to become a candidate accompanied by a filing fee equal to one percent of the annual salary for such position. Either the nomination petition or the declaration and filing fee must be filed by the filing deadline for other local offices.
- (b) The terms of the sheriff and the register of deeds shall expire on the Monday before the second unified board of commissioners meeting in December after a biennial unified government election, when the newly elected sheriff and register of deeds shall take office.

Section 5. That said original Sections 2-52, 2-57, and 2-141 of the Code of the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas, be and are hereby repealed.

Section 6. This ordinance and resolution shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval, and publication in the official Unified Government newspaper.

AN ORDINANCE relating to the nomination, appointment and term of members, vacancies and removal of members, compensation and meetings, of the various agencies, boards, committees and commissions created by or under the authority of the Unified Government Commission, amending original Sections 2-381, 2-382, 2-383, 2-384, 2-385, 2-387, 2-388, 2-389, 2-423, 2-424, 2-426, 2-436, 2-439, 2-512, 2-513, 2-532, 2-551, 2-554, and 2-573, of the Code of the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas, and repealing said original Sections 2-381, 2-382, 2-383, 2-384, 2-385, 2-387, 2-388, 2-389, 2-423, 2-424, 2-426, 2-436, 2-439, 2-512, 2-513, 2-532, 2-551, 2-554, and 2-573,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE UNIFIED GOVERNMENT OF WYANDOTTE COUNTY/KANSAS CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1. The following new sections are hereby adopted:

New Sec. 2-390. - Quorum; meetings.

Fifty-one percent of the members of any agency board, committee or commission created by or under the authority of the Unified Government shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting its business and exercising its powers and for all other purposes, notwithstanding the existence of any vacancies. Action shall be taken upon a vote of a majority of the members present, unless in any case the bylaws shall require a larger number. Meetings of the members shall be held anywhere within the perimeter boundaries of the area of operation. Meetings shall be called by the chairman.

New Sec. 2-391 Application of Division 1

Unless otherwise required by federal or state law, or otherwise provided by this Article VIII, the provisions of this Division I shall apply to any agency, board, committee or commission created by or under the authority of the Unified Government.

Section 2. That original Sections of the Code of the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas, be and the same are hereby amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE VIII. - BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, ETC.

DIVISION 1. - GENERALLY

Sec. 2-381. - Nomination and appointment.

~~Unless provided otherwise by federal, state or local law, u~~Upon the creation or recreation of any agency, board, committee or commission, the mayor and unified government commissioners each shall nominate an individual to such agency, board, committee or commission. The persons nominated shall be voted on by the full commission. An appointment to a position on any agency, board, committee or commission shall be made upon the affirmative vote of six members of the unified government commission.

Sec. 2-382. - Term of office.

- (a) ~~Unless provided otherwise by federal, state or local law, t~~The terms of office of all members to any agency, board, commission, committee, or other entity created by or under the authority of the unified government shall be four years, subject to the provisions in this section. The positions indicated in the following table shall be filled by the person nominated by the commission member set out adjacent to each respective position after approval by the full commission:

(b) Except as otherwise provided herein, the terms of each member of an agency, board, committee, commission, or other entity created by or under the authority of the unified government shall coincide with the term of the appointing mayor or commissioner.

~~(c) Beginning on the effective date of this ordinance/resolution [adopted May 5, 2016], each term of the incumbent members of an agency, board, committee, commission, or other entity created by or under the authority of the unified government shall terminate on March 31 of the even-numbered year next following the original expiration of the position's term. Thereafter all terms shall begin on April 1 of an even-numbered year.~~

~~(d)~~(c) Notwithstanding any other provision in this section, unless he or she resigns his or her position or forfeits such position under section 2-384, an incumbent member of an agency, board, committee, commission, or other entity created by or under the authority of the unified government shall continue in the position to which he or she has been appointed until a successor is appointed.

Sec. 2-383. - Vacancies.

~~Unless otherwise provided or required by applicable federal, state or local law, a~~A position on a board, committee, commission or agency created by or under the authority of the unified government or to which the unified government or a member thereof has the right or duty to appoint which becomes vacant, shall be filled according to the procedure set out in this division for the remainder of the unexpired term of the person vacating the position.

Sec. 2-384. - Forfeiture of office.

~~Unless differently provided or required by federal, state or local law, a~~Any person appointed to any agency, board, committee or commission either created by or under the authority of the unified government or to which the unified government or any member thereof has the right or duty to appoint a person to said positions, shall be deemed without further action by the unified government to have forfeited said office upon failing to attend three consecutive meetings without providing prior notice of an intended absence to the chairperson of said agency, board, committee or commission. The chairperson shall forthwith report to the unified government clerk the name of any person upon the occurrence of three consecutive absences.

Sec. 2-385. - Compensation.

~~Unless specifically provided or required by federal, state or local law, n~~No person appointed to any agency, board, committee or commission created by or under the authority of the unified government, shall receive any compensation for said service. Nothing herein shall prohibit the unified government from specifically authorizing or providing for the reimbursement of reasonable expenses.

Sec. 2-387. - Meetings.

All agencies, boards, committees and commissions shall adhere to the state Open Meetings Act, K.S.A. 45-201, and the chairperson or his designee shall prepare an agenda for all meetings and cause to be maintained minutes of all meetings and proceedings. Said minutes shall be regularly filed with the unified government clerk ~~and forwarded to the Unified Government~~
Commission.

Sec. 2-388. - Chairpersons.

~~Unless otherwise required by federal, state or local law, t~~The mayor shall appoint the chairperson of all agencies, boards, committees or commissions. Nothing herein shall prohibit the unified government from adopting an ordinance or resolution providing that the members of a specified agency, board, commission or committee may elect a chairperson from their membership.

Sec. 2-389. - Removal from office; procedure.

~~(a) Unless otherwise provided for by federal, state or local law, and except as provided for in subsection 2-389(c), the members of any agency, board, committee or commission created by or under the authority of the unified government serve at the pleasure of the unified government commission.~~

~~(b)~~(a) ~~Unless otherwise provided for by federal, state or local law, t~~The members of any agency, board, committee or commission created by or under the authority of the unified government may be removed at the request of the mayor, or commissioner (or their respective successor) that originally nominated the member, and upon the affirmative vote of six members of the unified government commission. However, if removal of the member would cause the agency, board, committee or commission to have less than a quorum to conduct business, the removal shall not become effective until the unified government commission has appointed a

replacement for the member being removed.

~~(e)~~(b) No member of any agency, board, committee or commission created by or under the authority of the unified government shall be removed during their term of office by ~~the mayor or~~ any commissioner that did not originally nominate the member, except for cause and after hearing held before the unified government commission and upon the affirmative vote of six members thereof. The ~~mayor or~~ commissioner requesting the removal shall provide a notice of such request, and the reasons stated for the removal, to the clerk of the unified government. The clerk of the unified government shall provide a copy of such request for removal to the mayor, the unified government commission, and the member whose removal is being requested, no less than 30 days prior to any such hearing.

DIVISION 3. - WYANDOTTE COUNTY DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES ORGANIZATION; ADVISORY BOARD

Sec. 2-423. - Composition of board; ~~nomination of members; appointment.~~

~~(a) — The county developmental disabilities advisory board shall consist of 11 members occupying positions to be numbered one through 11.~~

~~(b) — The mayor and each commissioner shall nominate a person to such advisory board. The full commission shall vote upon the persons nominated. Upon the affirmative vote of six or more members of the commission, the person shall be appointed.~~

~~(e)~~(a) The advisory board shall include at least one developmentally disabled consumer or a representative of a developmental disabilities consumer group and at least one family member of a developmentally disabled person.

~~(e)~~(b) The advisory board shall include as nearly as possible individuals representative of the following community sectors: developmental disabilities organizations; public health and welfare, medical professions and hospitals, judiciary, education, rehabilitation, labor, business, and civic groups.

~~Sec. 2-424. — Term of office.~~

~~The terms of office of the members of the advisory board shall be as follows. The positions indicated in the following table shall be filled by the person nominated by the commission member set out adjacent to each respective position upon approval by the full commission. Members appointed shall serve for a term of four years.~~

~~Requirements for filling vacancies, attendance at meetings, forfeiture of office, compensation, notice of appointments, meetings, and appointment of chairpersons for the advisory board shall be as set out in this article.~~

Sec. 2-426. - Powers and duties of the county developmental disabilities advisory board.

~~Beginning in the year 2001, t~~The county developmental disabilities advisory board shall make an annual recommendation to the board of commissioners concerning the annual plan and budget for county intellectual and developmental disabilities programs, including the allocation of funds raised by the mill levy for intellectual and developmental disabilities services authorized by K.S.A. 19-4004 and amendments thereto, and shall perform such other duties and responsibilities delegated to it by the board of commissioners.

DIVISION 4. - HOUSING AUTHORITY

Sec. 2-436. - Composition; appointment of members.

The city housing authority shall hereafter consist of 12 commissioners occupying positions to be numbered one through 12. Position number 12 shall be appointed by the mayor/CEO. The term of the commissioner appointed to position number 12 shall ~~be for four years from the~~

~~effective date of the resolution from which this division is derived. Except as provided herein, the terms of the commissioners, appointments to vacancies, and requirements for attendance at meetings shall be as set out by unified government ordinance or resolution.~~ coincide with the term of the Mayor/CEO.

~~Sec. 2-439. — Quorum; meetings.~~

~~Fifty one percent of those serving as commissioners of the housing authority shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting its business and exercising its powers and for all other purposes, notwithstanding the existence of any vacancies. Action shall be taken by the authority upon a vote of a majority of the commissioners present, unless in any case the bylaws of the authority shall require a larger number. Meetings of the commissioners of the authority shall be~~

~~held anywhere within the perimeter boundaries of the area of operation of the authority or within any additional area where the authority is authorized to undertake a project. Meetings of the commissioners of the authority shall be called by the chairman.~~

DIVISION 8. - SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Sec. 2-512. - Nomination, appointment, ~~and term of office.~~

The solid waste management committee shall hereafter consist of 11 members appointed by the unified government commission. Position number one shall be jointly nominated by the mayors of Edwardsville and Lake Quiviera. Position number two shall be nominated by the mayor of Bonner Springs. Position number three shall be nominated by the mayor/CEO of the unified government to represent the unincorporated area of the county, but need not be a resident of that area. Position numbers four, five, six, seven, and eight shall be nominated by the mayor/CEO of the unified government of to represent the city. Position number nine shall be nominated by the Mayor and be a representative of ~~Deffenbaugh Industries, Inc.~~ the Unified Government solid waste contractor. Position number ten shall be nominated by the Mayor and be a representative of ~~Allied Waste Industries, Inc./Forest View Landfill, LCC~~ the landfill servicing the solid waste contractor. Position number 11 shall be the deputy director of public works of the unified government.

~~(a) — Terms shall be for four years. The initial term shall begin upon the date of appointment, and shall end on October 1, 2007. Nothing in this resolution shall be construed to prohibit reappointment of a person for more than one term.~~

Sec. 2-513. — Vacancies.

~~Any position on the solid waste committee that becomes vacant shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term of the position according to the procedure set out in the foregoing section.~~

~~(Code 1988, § 2-1133; Res. No. 94-03, § 4, 11-6-2003)~~

~~Sec. 2-514. — Forfeiture of office, compensation, notice of appointments, meetings, and chairpersons.~~

~~Requirements for attendance at meetings, forfeiture of office, compensation, notice of appointments, meetings, and appointment of chairpersons shall be as set out in this article.~~

~~(Code 1988, § 2-1134; Res. No. 94-03, § 5, 11-6-2003)~~

DIVISION 9. - CORRECTIONS ADVISORY BOARD

Sec. 2-532. - Composition.

The corrections advisory board shall consist of 12 members and shall be constituted, selected and appointed in strict compliance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-5297. At-large members not designated by office shall be nominated by the mayor/CEO and appointed by the unified government commission.

DIVISION 10. - AREA-WIDE ADVISORY COUNCIL ON AGING

Sec. 2-551. - Established; membership generally.

There is hereby established an expanded area-wide advisory council on aging to be appointed by the boards of county commissioners of this county and of Leavenworth County, Kansas. The unified government board of commissioners ~~of this county~~ shall appoint 11-12 members, and the board of county commissioners of Leavenworth County, Kansas, shall appoint six members, for a total membership on the advisory council of 17-18 members. ~~Membership on the first advisory council shall begin on the date fixed by the board of county commissioners of this county.~~ Members shall be appointed by geographic designation with consideration given to interest, background and education.

Sec. 2-554. - Procedures and bylaws.

The advisory council on aging shall be governed by procedures and bylaws approved by the unified government county board of commissioners, and the provisions of Division 1.

DIVISION 11. - LAW ENFORCEMENT ADVISORY BOARD

Sec. 2-573. - Membership.

The law enforcement advisory board shall consist of 15 members occupying positions to be numbered 1 through 15. The chairman of the human relations commission shall be a permanent member of the commission and shall change only when a new chairman of the human relations commission is appointed. Positions 1 through 11 shall be appointed by each member of the unified board of commissioners according to Sections 2-381 and 2-382. ~~and shall correspond to their district number. The at-large commissioner no. 1 shall appoint position No. 9, the commissioner at large position No. 2 shall appoint position No. 10 and the mayor shall appoint position No. 11.~~ The county sheriff shall have three appointments, numbered positions 12, 13 and 14.

~~(1) All appointed positions shall commence their term on July 1, 2006. All odd-numbered positions shall serve a four-year term through and including June 30, 2010. All even-numbered positions shall serve a two-year term through June 30, 2008.~~

~~(2) Vacancies in any position shall be filled for the unexpired term. All members shall be eligible for reappointment at the discretion of the appointing person.~~

Section 3. That said original sections 2-381, 2-382, 2-383, 2-384, 2-385, 2-387, 2-388, 2-389, 2-423, 2-424, 2-426, 2-436, 2-439, 2-512, 2-513, 2-532, 2-551, 2-554, and 2-573, Article VIII, of the Code of the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval, and publication in the official Unified Government newspaper.
