• **APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES**

II- PRESENTATIONS, HEARINGS, COMMUNICATIONS

- **Visitors**

As a general rule, the Board will not enter discussion, but will direct Administration to take under advisement, make necessary response and bring items to a future agenda as may be appropriate.

- Ms. Louise Lynch - Spoke to the Park Board regarding concerning activities at Trolley Park. She also participated in a Zoom meeting on June 12th to address ongoing issues at the park. While some mobile trucks with permits are using the park appropriately to sell their products, others without permits are also selling, including alcohol, to minors without checking for identification. Ms. Lynch mentioned witnessing these activities. The minor opened in front of a police officer without any intervention. Ms. Lynch also brought to the Park Boards attention about the trash in the park, and vendors paying people to pick up trash. Parks & Recreation hasn't mowed the area, and the wintertime park doesn't get salted; Ms. Lynch has contacted Public Works and is still waiting for a response also spoke to Chief Oakman last week, and he states there are no issues at Trolley Park. She has asked for Parks and Recreation to help with a plan to address this issue.

III – OLD BUSINESS

- Alyssa Marcy presented the Waterway Corridor Plan, focusing on the CSO19 area in Northeast Kansas City Kansas. The project aims to reduce combined sewer overflow into Jersey Creek by constructing storm and sanitary sewers. Construction began in May 2024, with plans for green spaces and an expanded greenway corridor. Waterway Park to Jersey Creek will create an open channel for stormwater conveyance, expand Big Eleven Lake's green space and narrow Waterway Drive, and make mobility improvements. The project requires closing 11th Street between State Ave. and Washington Blvd. They seek community and Park Board support for the plan and additional funding.  - Alyssa Marcy – Answered, only the pipe work titled, CSO19 due to the deadline by Spring of 2025, no amenity has started which is the waterway quarter plan is a two-part plan
- Sarah Lynch – Wanted to confirm, that Public Works is asking the community to vote which will permit us to pursue grants for this project
 - Alyssa Marcy – Answered, Yes

V - OTHER BUSINESS

Staff Agenda

Shaya Lockett –

- Recreation Updates –
 - Parkwood Pool closed on Sunday due to the lifeguards and kids having to go back to school; stated we had a successful season
 - Parks & Recreation had two summer camps. One took place at Beatrice Lee Community Center and focused on theater. The kids helped write and perform a great play at the end of the camp season, which they were very proud of. We invited parents to attend the performance. The other camp was Eisenhower Community Center focused on traditional camp activities.
 - We are still accepting registration for fall sports; flag football registration closes on August 22nd. Soccer and Volleyball closes on August 30th
 - Asked the Park Board if they know anyone interested in being a coach or becoming a certified sports official, please have them reach out to Parks and Recreation
 - Shared the report with the Park Board for Community Participation Data, including participant counts for all Community Center programs.

- Shared with Park Board, we are running a campaign on social media entitled “Enjoy Don’t Destroy” we created due to all the recent vandalism happening in our Parks. We had our marketing coordinator create a campaign to inform the community and to make them aware of recent vandalism at our park restrooms and playground. We want everyone to know what to do if they see vandalism and we are asking the community to help. As we enhance amenities
- Shaya Lockett - Parks and Recreation is finalizing the program guide for fall and winter activities. It will be available online next week and shared with the Park Board at next month’s meeting.
- Jim Schneweise – How do we determine if we had a productive pool season?
 - Shaya Lockett – Answered; we look at attendance, incident reports, customer feedback
- Jim Schneweise – Asked how we communicate with the schools on upcoming sports and activities
 - Shaya Lockett – Answered that we communicate electronically with them and send all our information via their platform. We attend school events to distribute flyers and provide information. For instance, I and another staff member participated in a back-to-school event at Home Fields, where we interacted with families and handed out information.
- Mario Escobar – Asked about all the vandalism happening, what we have done in the past, and whether we are seeing more.
 - Angel Ferrara – Yes, it has been a recurring issue. Our communication and transparency have not been the best, and we strive to improve. It's important for everyone to know. We are also documenting all vandalism. We must do our part, educate our community, and take ownership. If you see something, say something. Let’s invest in something new, not repairing what shouldn’t have been broken. We have also shared with the media, and put on local news
- Sarah Lynch – Asked if we have considered investing in ring cameras
 - Angel Ferrara mentioned that they are installing cameras in parks and community centers using funding from ARPA. They are working on installing ring cameras that can interact with the Sheriff’s department and the PD system for streamlined access.

Vincent Billaci –

- Park Updates –
 - Vandalism in the parks was discussed at last month's meeting. Pictures of the damages caused by fireworks were passed out to the Park Board. We also brought additional pictures from the previous week showing damage to the Rosedale restroom. It's one thing to talk about it, but seeing it destroyed brings the issue to light.
 - Klamm Park – Trail is currently out to bid, and will be a three-quarter mile; the deadline is August 21st
 - Clopper Park – We are waiting for the rubber surfacing to be placed, hopefully this will be completed next month, also the parking lot has had major improvements
 - Clifton Spray Park is now opened

Angel Ferrara -

- Project Updates –
 - Angel Ferrara – Advised in tonight's packet that there is an invite to all the ribbon cuttings that will be taking place, we invited the community to attend. Parks & Recreation will organize a tour to showcase the projects, as there are many to celebrate; the tour will begin at 11:00 am - 1:00 pm on Friday, August 23rd.
 - Angel reminded the Park Board that the projects were made possible through Community Development Block grant dollars. We have also invited State and Federal representatives to attend, as they significantly distributed the HUD funding.
 - Boston Daniels Park – The Project is out for the second part of the bid; closing date ends August 21st
 - Clifton Spray Park – We were able to get to open before the end of the spray park season
 - Last night, the public hearing place and wanted to thank, Ms. Lynch and Sarah Lynch for advocating for Parks & Recreation. They will be voting on budget

reductions affecting services, vacant lot mowing, abatement team operations, the county capital, and the potential loss of six employee

VI – BOARD MEMBERS’S QUESTIONS OR COMMENTS

- Sarah Lynch – Asked, if there is a charge for the use of the pickleball court
 - Angel Ferrara mentioned that currently there is no charge for using the courts. In the future, there may be an option to reserve them for tournaments. They have received inquiries from organizations interested in using the courts for fundraisers, so they plan to establish a reservation process. Angel assured that there will always be courts available for use by the community.
- Amanda DeVriese-Sebilla – Stated she heard that the Joe E. Amayo Community Center will be closed on Mondays
 - Angel Ferrara – Answered that all the Community Centers will be closed on Mondays, we did share this information with the Park Board in May; this is to give our employees a five-day workweek, this change has nothing to do with the budget, and this implementation is largely due to the challenges that we have with recruiting staff and retaining staff. The feedback we’ve received from our staff is that working six days a week is challenging because they only get one day off. As a result, we’ve had difficulty recruiting for the recreation division. We’ve been working with the administration to implement a change to address this issue.
- Sarah Lynch – Asked, how much revenue will Parks & Recreation will lose if they decide to cut the department’s budget
 - Angel Ferrara – Stated about three-quarters of a million dollars
- Sarah Lynch – Asked if the information that was handed out tonight on the community participation data will be used on what centers stay open
 - Shaya Lockett confirmed that the community center hours will be determined by current class schedules and participation, and will be the same across all centers, will have the same hours
- Karen Daniels – Asked for an update on the Jersey Creek basketball court
 - Angel Ferrara - Answered JT's is scheduled to be out this week to start the mural; despite the rain slowing us down, McConnell's has done a great job with getting the paint laid
- Karen Daniels – Due to the budget cuts, will Kensington Park project be affected

- Angel Ferrara – Answered, No the project has already grant funded and approved
- Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook – Thanked the Parks & Recreation for the hard work

Mario Escobar, Chairman requested to adjourn; Kevin Mitchell made a motion; Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook seconded the motion meeting was adjourned at 6:56 PM Motion.

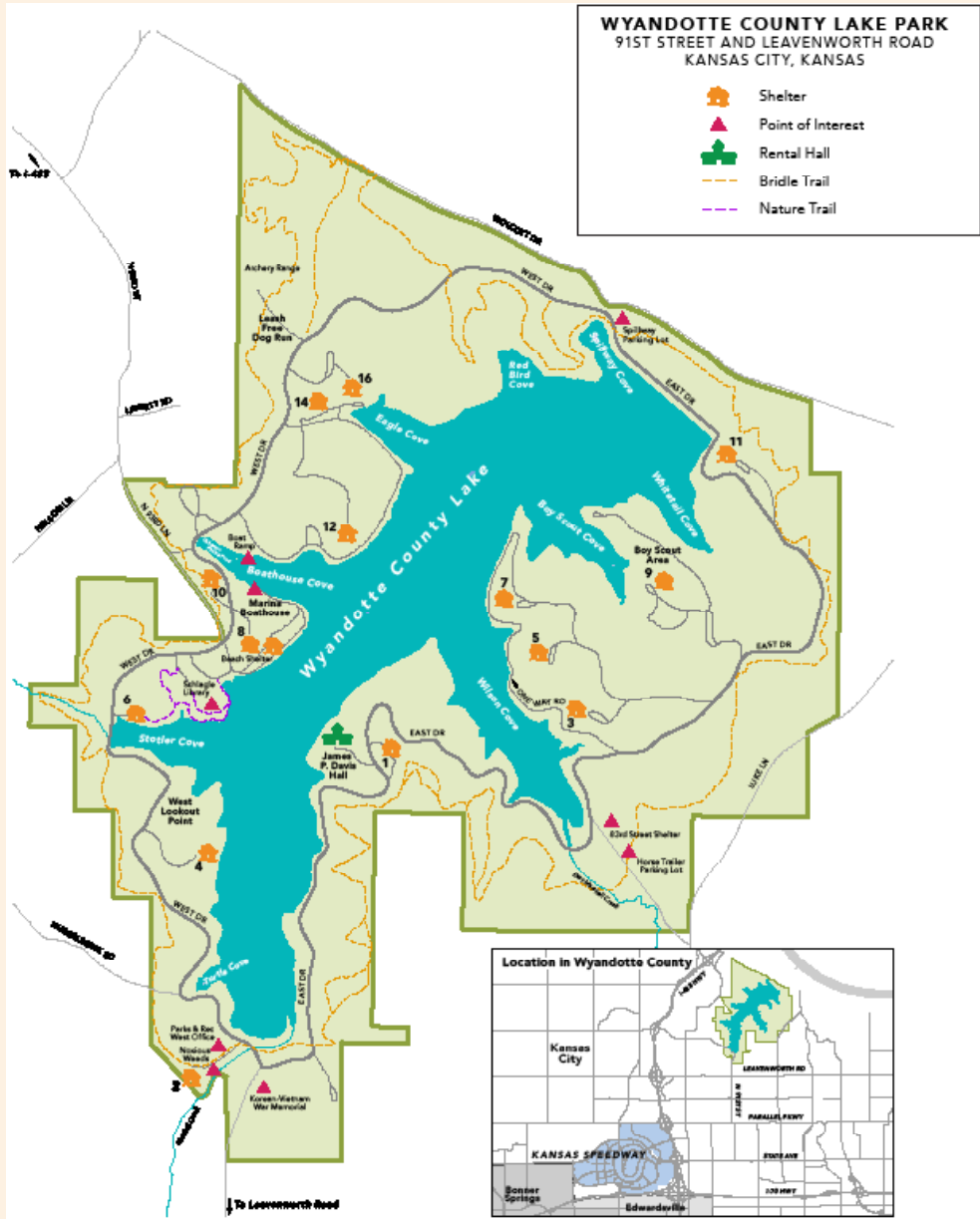

RENTAL HALLS



GEORGE MEYN HALL 126th and STATE AVE.

The George Meyn Hall, 126th & State Ave., is located in Wyandotte County Park. This building has a large dining hall, kitchen, full size stage, beer room, coat room and a large foyer. Capacity is 350 people.

A playground is adjacent to the Meyn Building; a skate park and tennis courts are within walking distance. Sunflower Hills Golf Course and the Junior Golf Course are also adjacent to the building.



JAMES P. DAVIS HALL WYANDOTTE COUNTY LAKE PARK 91st and LEAVENWORTH RD.

James P. Davis Hall is located at Wyandotte County Lake, 91st and Leavenworth Road. The hall has a large kitchen, a dining room and a dance or meeting room. The capacity for this building is 150 people. It also has a patio overlooking the lake where many weddings have been held.

James P. Davis Hall is a lodge style building constructed in the late 1930s from native stone and timber. It is one of the most unique wedding locations in the metropolitan area.



PIERSON COMMUNITY CENTER 1800 S. 55th

Pierson Community Center, 1800 South 55th, is located in Pierson Park. This is the largest facility in the park system with a large dining room, a huge kitchen, a large bar room and a coat room. Capacity is 500 people.

Pierson Park also offers fishing, skate park, spray park, playground, tennis courts and three picnic shelters.

HOW TO RESERVE A HALL

The reservation halls are suitable for wedding receptions, family reunions and business meetings. Smoking is prohibited inside of the facilities. Alcohol is allowed for certain reservations and security is required. Reservations are accepted up to one year

in advance. Reservations are only accepted in person and the fee and deposit are both due at that time. For more information on renting a hall please call 913-573-8327.

FISHING & BOATING



Season begins the 1st Saturday in March (weather permitting) through November 30.

Fishing Rules and Regulations:

- 1. Fishing at Wyandotte County Lake 6:00am to 11:30pm. Fishermen must have vacated the parks by midnight.
- 2. Residents ages 16-64 must have a Unified Government fishing permit in their possession in addition to their Kansas State fishing license to fish at Wyandotte County Lake.
- 3. All non-Kansas residents 16 years of age and over must have a permit.
- 4. Each angler is limited to 2 lines with no more than 2 baited hooks or artificial lures per line.
- 5. Administration reserves the right to prohibit any or all fishing and boating at any time.
- 6. Each angler must keep his/her fish on a separate individual stringer or suitable container, so Sheriff Department can easily identify possession and creel limits.
- 7. Trot lines, bank lines, jug lines, netting or seining of fish is not permitted.
- 8. Anglers may fish the entire lake except where posted. No bank fishing in the boathouse cove.
- 9. Anglers must abide by State Rules and Regulations.
- 10. No open season on frogs, snakes or turtles.

Boating Rules and Regulations:

- 1. Boating at Wyandotte County Lake is permitted from 6:00 am to 11:30 am Boaters must be off the lake by 11:30am so the park can close by midnight.
- 2. Water vessels are permitted on Wyandotte County Lake only. All vessels must have permits and they are to be displayed on the right rear transom of the vessel.
- 3. Proper lighting must be displayed on the vessel from sunset to sunrise.
- 4. All children 12 and under must wear Coast Guard approved life preservers while on the vessel. Life preservers must be visible and easily accessible for all passengers on the vessel.
- 5. No reckless operation of a vessel will be tolerated.
- 6. No wake in coves.
- 7. 20 mph Speed Limit throughout the lake.
- 8. No personal watercraft, tubing or water-skiing.
- 9. No one will operate a vessel while intoxicated or under the influence of drugs.
- 10. Sailboards and Kayaks are permitted. Preservers and permits are required for both.
- 11. No vessel may fish from or tie up to any pontoon dock. Slip owners are excluded, but they must be on their boat and in their own slip. No fishing from the docks.
- 12. Vessels will be respectful and courteous to bank anglers.
- 13. Misconduct or violation of rules and regulations will result in fines and loss of boating privileges.
- 14. Administration reserves the right to prohibit any or all fishing and boating at any time.
- 15. Swimming from boats is allowed. Ask for rules and regulations.

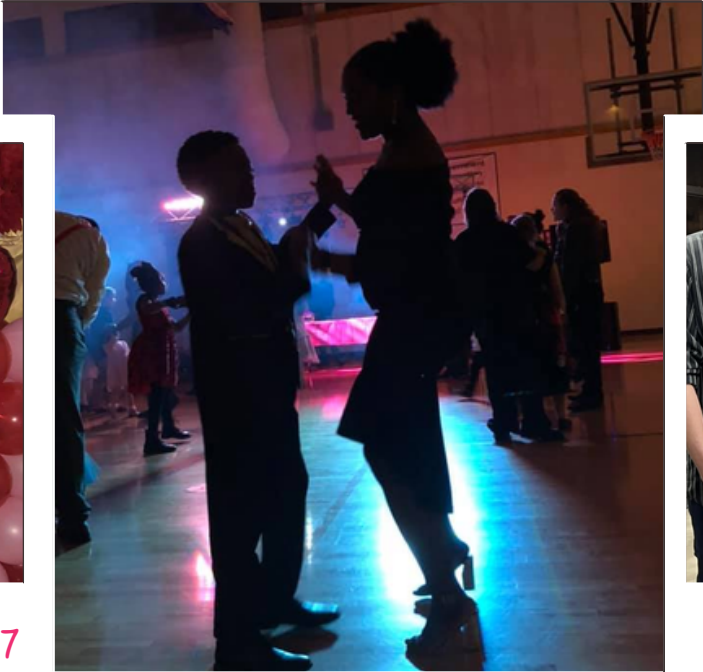

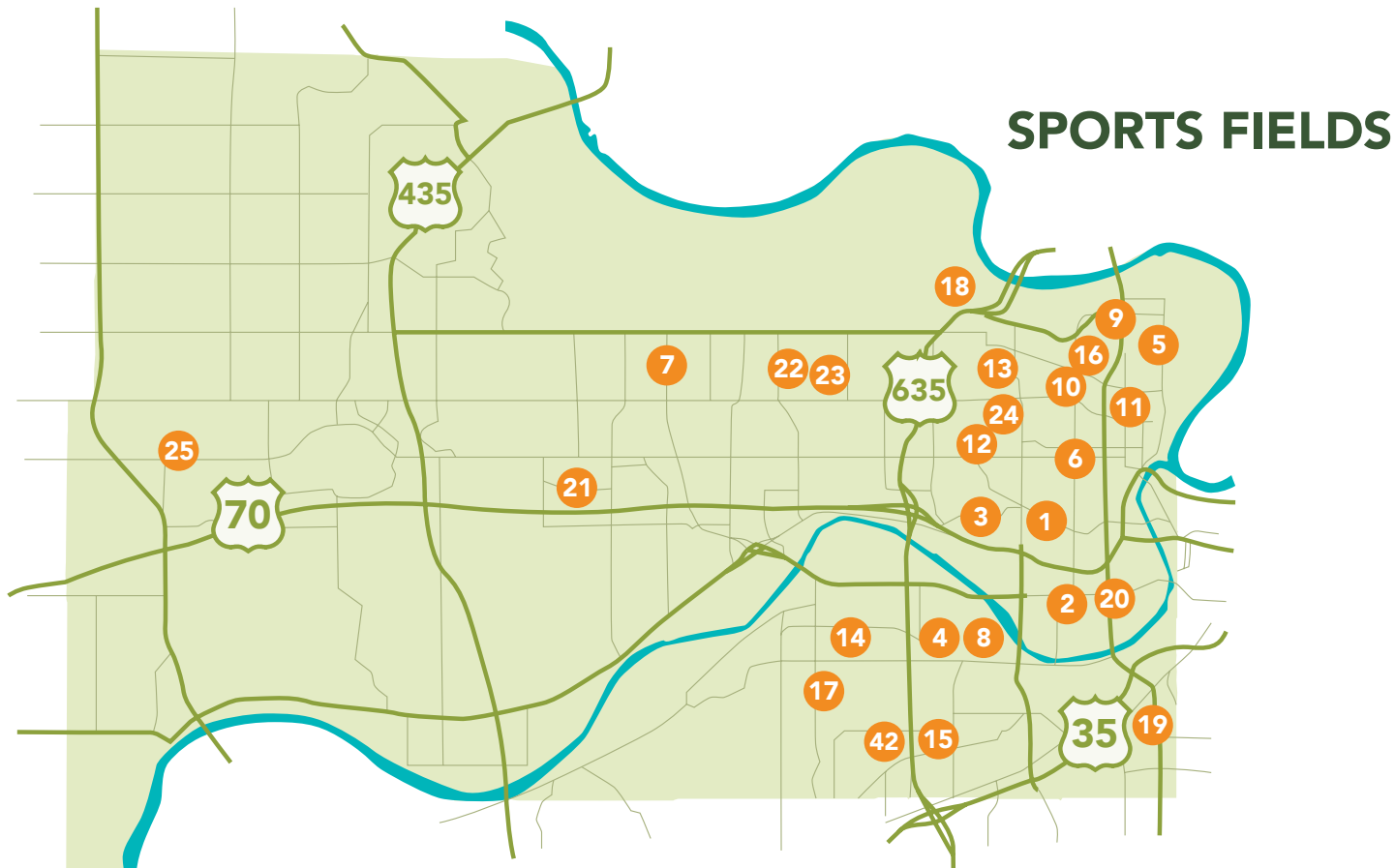

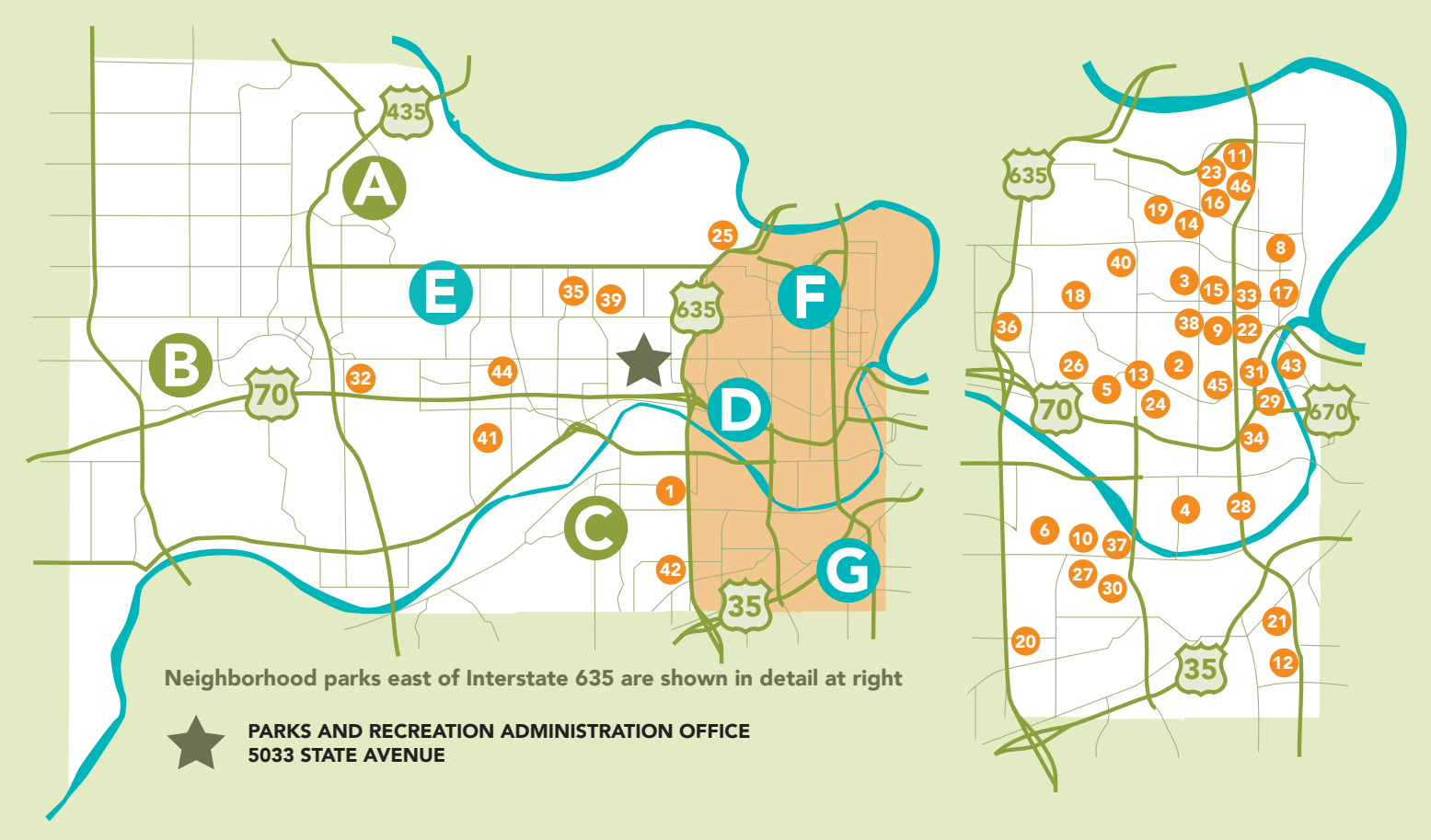

AZURA AMPHITHEATRE 633 N. 130TH, BONNER SPRINGS, KS 66102

Azura Amphitheatre is an open-air performance venue located in Bonner Springs, Kansas. Opened in 1984 as Sandstone Amphitheatre, it is a place where concert fans have been making memories for over twenty years. Audience capacity at Azura Center Amphitheatre is 18,000 people, including approximately 3,100 box and reserved seats.

CROSS COUNTRY TRAIL

The Cross Country Trail is located in Wyandotte County Park, 126th and State Avenue. The closest access to the trail is adjacent to Shelter F on 126th by the first entrance into the park. Many schools in the metropolitan area have used this trail for their cross country events. The trail is mowed summer and fall the public is welcome to use the trail except for days scheduled for school events. If Shelter F is reserved, additional parking for runners is available at the soccer field.

BRIDLE TRAIL

The bridle trail at Wyandotte County Lake Park, 91st and Leavenworth Road, is a scenic 10 mile ride. The trail starts at the 83rd Street entrance next to a horse trailer parking lot. There is no fee for horses, riders, trailers. The trail is open during daylight hours only.

NOXIOUS WEEDS

Herbicides to eradicate those weeds deemed noxious by the Kansas Legislature, will be sold at the Noxious Weeds office located in front of Shelter 2 at Wyandotte County Lake Park. To purchase the chemicals, you must be a Wyandotte County resident, be able to identify one or more noxious weeds on your property, and have an ID proving your residency. Cash is the only method of payment accepted. VACANT LOTS

THE WYANDOTTE COUNTY PARKS FOUNDATION

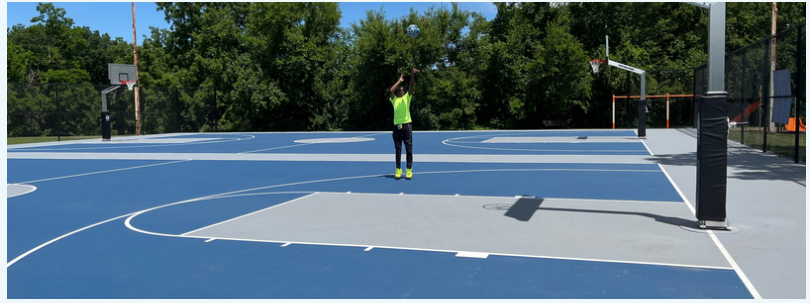

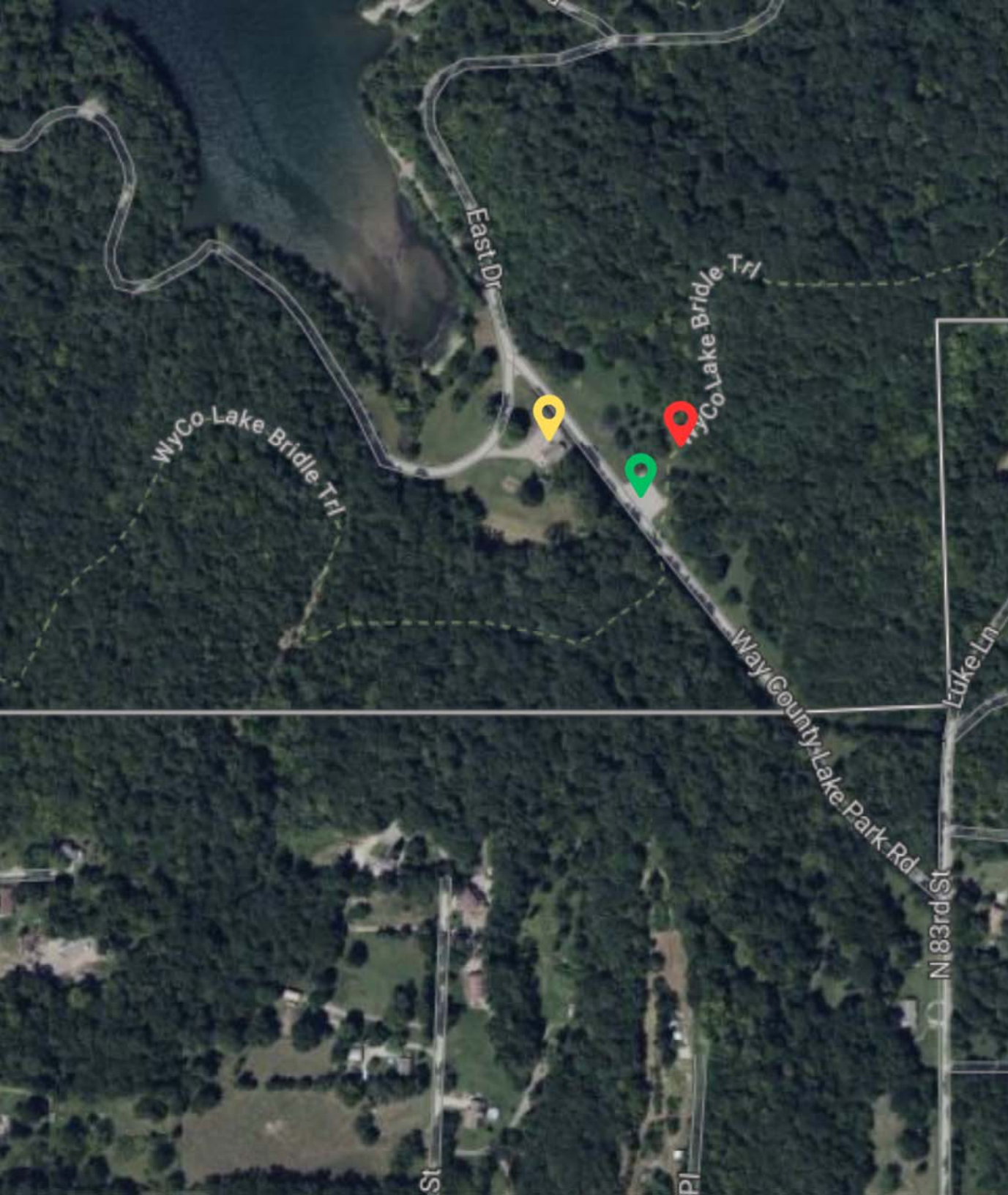
