The September 11th, 2024, meeting of the Unified Government WyCo/KCK Board of Park Commissioners was held at City Hall 701 N. 7th St. Room 515, Kansas City, KS 66101 & Virtually-Via Zoom

The meeting of the Unified Government Board of Park Commissioners was called to order at 6:01 p.m. by Mario Escobar, Chairman. Angel Ferrara, Director stated proper meeting notice had been given.

III– OLD BUSINESS

- Request for a Letter of Support for the Waterway Corridor Plan by Alyssa Marcy with the Unified Government Department of Planning and Urban Design
- Sarah Schaefer – Stated that she and Alyssa Marcy have an update, on the Waterway Corridor plan codification. This is the planning component of this particular area, that on

August 26th, Alyssa Marcy presented the Waterway Corridor Plan at the Park Board meeting and requested that it be fast-tracked for the Commission meeting. On September 26th, she requested an official vote for a Letter of Support for the plan.

- Mario Escobar –Refreshed the Park Board on the request for a letter of recommendation from Alyssa Marcy with the Unified Government Department of Planning and Urban
 - Angel Ferrara – Alyssa Marcy, did present last month at Park Board. In general, it seemed like the Park Board was very supportive of it, but she did ask for a letter of support and wanted to come back to the Park Board and take an official vote, to ensure that the Park Board is supportive of the initiative and the efforts, and that we can provide a letter of support.
- Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook – In last month's presentation, there were questions about how much the community would be involved and consulted throughout the process. It was stated that at each phase
 - Sarah Schaefer – We use our plans as a reference during Capital Improvement Projects and ensure they align with our vision, it's kind of a guidepost for us to ensure that we're planning infrastructure the way that it would support the vision of those planning documents, she wanted to make sure they understand that this is only planning document. "Waterway Corridor" refers to the historical flow of water through the space and does not specify a particular park.
- Karen Daniel – Ask if the letter of support is for work that's already underway.
 - Sarah Schaefer – Answered, no, this is for the planning document to codify the plan that this document has. It has nothing to do with capital engineering documents or construction plans.
 - Angel Ferrara – Responded, to help clarify Karen Daniels question, Alyssa mentioned at the last meeting that some work has started around the big 11 area, specifically regulatory work that is under construction.
- Sarah Schaefer - Correct, we do have regulatory work that is under construction. Now, and we had to take a very specific design tracked because we weren't able to roll particular visions or substantiate them. So that's why it's important for us as engineers to have these codified documents for us to reference Park Board to support proposed plans and ideas
- Sarah Lynch – Asked, why they need a letter of support. If it's not going to have community input
 - Sarah Schaefer – Answered, this letter of support is for the codification of a planning document that went through extensive public engagement to get it to its draft form, this is not a construction plan. It is what we, as engineers, utilize to understand and recommend engineering plans for capital investment

- Angel Ferrara – Stated Alyssa Marcy was here last month and stated a lot of work is mandated through a consent decree and this piece in particular, is some of the improvement that could come out specifically as it relates to Parks and Recreations, Alyssa Marcy, did share a lot of the community engagement efforts that they had been doing, this is some steps in the right direction to make sure we're including our Park Board along the way.
- Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook - Made a motion to approve a letter of recommendation in support of the Waterway Corridor Plan, a motion was seconded by Kevin Mitchell, vote was taken, Mario Escobar Aye, Kevin Mitchell Aye, Jim Scheneweise Aye, Karen Daniels Aye, Andrea Behrman Aye, Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook Aye, Ashely Williamson Abstained, Sarah Lynch Nay.

Motion carried (Ayes 6, Nays 1, Abstained 1)

- Update from the Unified Government Public Works Department regarding Stormwater and Park improvements to 8th, Northrup, and Splitlog Parks
 - Angel Ferrara - We've brought this item to the Park Board before and wanted to keep you informed about park-related projects tonight, Miss Sarah Schaeffer and Christina Blevins from Public Works will provide an update.
- Sarah Schaefer - Presented a slide on the Waterway Corridor Plan Codification, referencing the Parks & Recreation Master Plan from 2017 to understand water sewer projects and localized flooding. the specific location was regulatory in nature and the Parks Master Plan. Sewer Separation Project CSO 44, location is on 8th Street Park, which is in construction right now. ARPA and the stormwater portion of this project is known as 8th Street Park. Currently, we are at 60% design complete. We had our 90% design review today; our land acquisition is 80% complete, and the total cost estimate is \$ 1.1 million.
- Sarah Schaefer - Mentioned that Split Log Park is being considered for flooding mitigation. The plan is to use about \$150,000 of ARPA funding to enhance its stormwater functionality and improve park amenities, with a total cost of around \$1.1 million. It's important to note that stormwater funding has specific usage restrictions.
- Sarah Schaefer - Gave information on Northrop Park; we realized the bigger momentum was here at Northrop Park for some of those like playground vertical spaces. Enhancing our ability to provide access to this space as well as enhance stormwater needs. Continued with more information on the alternate parking, it hasn't been vetted by engineering, The city traffic engineer, or the county engineer, currently, however, this is a concept of what an accessible and easily attainable parking alternative could be. And that's with the closure of the Grand Boulevard cut-off, we would make sure to do once we get an approved plan to bring or an approved concept, we will come back to get

feedback, one of our highest priorities is to make sure that this is not only just the safety on the engineering side of it, but the long-term maintenance side, because this would be something that would come into the Parks asset. And for us to ensure that we're providing long life on either the top whether we do a complete mill and overlay before striping

- Ashley Williamson – Asked about the vegetation will you be installing will there be one tree canopy that's being installed, the second question is the long-term maintenance plan on this because if it's not managed by parks, will it ever be managed by parks, and will maintenance end up being their responsibility
 - Sarah Schaefer – Answered, no it shouldn't, because this is part of our stormwater program. We need it for stormwater attenuation and stormwater management in and around the spaces.
- Ashley Williamson – Asked if they plan on sending out a third-party survey to measure your impact of success and engagement in these spaces
 - Sarah Schaefer – Stated this is a great idea, and to take this into consideration
- Sarah Schaefer – Stated we have requested action from this, given the public interest and you know the highest priority from our public engagement of Northrop Park, we have requested the Park Board and direct staff, to submit a letter of request to the county engineer, showing support, to further investigate this option. For the closure of the Grandview Boulevard cut-off for this space, to keep the process moving, APRA timeline is very limited time. This would be something that we would want to use ARPA, funds on because stormwater funds cannot build a parking facility. We must make sure that we're allocating funds in the space so that we can manage our accounts on our side as well as the bid package. The bid package for ARPA must be out by mid-October to meet our minimum deadlines of being allocated and awarded with all contracts signed by the end of the year
- Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook – Asked, Angel Ferrara if Parks & Recreation is in favor of this new parking since this involves parks
 - Angel Ferrara – Answered, yes, we've worked closely with Public Works in the community on this project, and a lot of their information came from the 2017 data from the Master Plan, along with a series of community engagement sessions, staff is supportive of looking into exploring option on closing the road
- Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook – Ask how the community in this area, about their thoughts about closing the street off. What kind of feedback did you get from them?
 - Sarah Schaefer – Answered, no we have not gotten with the community and their views on the closing of the road because if there's no interest, we're not going to

- Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook – Wanted to confirm if we say, go ahead and investigate it, then you'll investigate it, and then come back with what the community shared on their thoughts
- Sarah Lynch – Requested to get public feedback on closing off the road, at the Grand Boulevard cut-off at Northrop Park
- Mario Escobar – Made a motion with the Park Board to initiate a further investigation by Public Works.
- A motion was made by Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook and seconded by Sarah Lynch
- Vote was taken, Mario Escobar Aye, Kevin Mitchell Aye, Jim Scheneweise Aye, Andrea Behrman Aye, Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook, Aye, Ashely Williamson Aye, Sarah Lynch Aye.

IV- NEW BUSINESS

- Request for Name Change of Waterway Park to Flunder Park
 - Ms. Fela Cherry joined the Park Board via Zoom about the renaming of Waterway Park, she shared a letter to the Park Board We should rename the park to Admiral Flunder in honor of her father. He made a significant impact in the Kansas City, Kansas area, working at the John F. Kennedy Recreation Community Center and overseeing softball leagues at Klammer Park. He dedicated a lot of time to teaching young people various sports and believed in the positive impact sports can have on people's lives.
- Kevin Mitchell – Gave his thoughts on the request for the name change, he believes it will lose some of its historical significance as this was one of three parks available where African American teams were allowed to play, by changing the name the history will be forgotten
 - Ms. Fela Cherry – Responded to Kevin's concern, and stated that there are many ways to honor history, add signage, or add elements within the park
- Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook – Asked if the naming of the park could have both names, to honor them both, Waterway Park and Admiral Flunder, as she agreed with Kevin about the losing history
 - Ms. Fela Cherry – Stated she thought Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook had a great idea and this is something they could agree on

- Sarah Lynch – Shared her thoughts, she appreciates the enthusiasm and advocacy for your father and her family, and she expressed discomfort with renaming the park due to the strong attachment to "Waterway Park" within the community.
 - Ms. Fela Cherrie – We spoke with many neighbors in the community after sharing the history of her father, they were excited about the opportunity to honor her father
- Ashley Williamson – She agrees with Kevin Mitchell, that the park's historical significance may diminish. The neighborhood needs to understand this, as it could impact their views on renaming the park.
 - Andrea Behrman – She expressed her agreement with Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook, emphasizing the importance of honoring both the history of the Waterway and the dedicated women and men who have devoted decades of their lives to parks and recreation.
- Angel Ferrara – Wanted to make sure that the Park Board had made their comments. Stated that this item was brought from the mayor's office, and advised there is a renaming policy with Unified Government, Angel wanted to ask our Assistant Chief Legal Counsel Wendy Green to walk us through and we can share this information with Ms. Fela Cherry
 - Wendy Green – Offered to send the policy to Ms. Fela Cherry and provide contact information. This policy is for renaming an existing park or neighborhood park, and they'll need a petition with 200 signatures from zip codes within a 3-mile radius of the park. First, you must submit an application, to the Government Clerk, who will then forward it to the Parks and Recreation Department for a thorough review to ensure all qualifications have been met. Subsequently, the application will return to the Park Board for presentation and review, and the Park Board will make a recommendation. The application will be presented to the Standing Committee, which will be informed of the Board's recommendation. The Standing Committee votes to forward it to the full commission, and then it goes on to the full commission.
- Louis Lynch – Joined the Park Board via Zoom, wanted to share her views on the renaming of Waterway Park, wanted to bring to the Park Board's attention that Ms. Fela Cherri's mother has a Jr. College building named after her which is an honor, "She stated that she wasn't familiar with her parents until she started getting calls from the community with concerns. Many community members have requested an investigation into the renaming because of the controversies surrounding it. Chester Owens, who recently passed away, is associated with the history and great advocacy and activism in the community." Feels that they should honor someone else
- Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook – Asked Angel Ferrara if Parks has any plans for this as the changes go on for all the construction

- Angel Ferrara – Answered, we would like to explore opportunities, however, it all depends on funding, currently we have no capital funding at this time
- Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook – Stated there might be a future opportunity to name a field versus the whole Waterway Park
- Jim Schneweise – Stated the more you can share with our community about the history we have the better we're going to be, we have the opportunity here to really educate our community

V - OTHER BUSINESS

● Staff Agenda

Shaya Lockett -

- Recreation Updates -
 - Recreation Dept- Has officially changed the hours of our community centers beginning September 3rd, 2024. We are now open 5 days a week. They are open Tuesday through Friday, from 1:00 pm – 9:00 pm, and on Saturdays from 8:00 am - 4:00 pm. The change of the hours has helped with getting more applicants. In addition, we have adjusted the hours of our supervisors, they are now working spilt shifts; to help oversee and help with the lack of staffing, their schedule is now Mondays 8 am-5 pm and Tuesdays & Wednesdays 10:00 am to 7:00 pm to provide additional coverage in the facilities. We will continue to evaluate the process and see what the results are for the community.
 - Parks & Recreation shared our new 2024 program guide, which was shared with the Park Board, this guide includes information about all our parks, the activities that each Community Center holds various special events that the department will host for the fall and winter months as well as youth sports leagues. We also have shared online
 - This Saturday at Compass Minerals fields at 8:30 am we will start with our youth sports for Fall soccer.
 - Flag football - Will begin on Tuesdays at Eisenhower.
 - Youth Volleyball - Didn't have enough people registered to have a full league, however, we are making sure to provide clinics, to keep working on their skills. The number is growing which shows we are getting the information out to the public, and we hope to continue to see it grow, the number last year we had 11 that registered,

and we had 26 this year, the count is for all age leagues, parents are appreciative for the clinics being held

- Clopper Park – Movie in the Park event, Shaya invited the Park Board
- Jim Schneweise – Asked if we have any prospects on staff, at Earl Watson (Bethany) Community Center on getting the community center back open at this moment we are only having events that were scheduled before the closing
 - Shaya Lockett – Responded if we are successful in recruiting applicants and filling all our positions, we will reopen, but we must make sure we have adequate staff. To get that reopened, we had five interviews today and three earlier this week, we have been actively recruiting

Vincent Billaci –

- Park Updates –
 - Shared news that the Holiday Light show will not be returning this year, they are re-evaluating and will hopefully make a return in the future at the Wyco Park
 - Dog Park, off the leash at Wyandotte County Lake is out for bid for fencing
 - Vietnam and Korean War Memorial, close to Wyandotte County Lake entrance, is out for bid to do some restoration, primarily the concrete, and some other upgrade work on the memorial.
 - Klammm Park – We have received bids back for the walking trail a three-quarter mile trail, we are reviewing bids now and will be selecting a contractor soon, for the rubber surfacing, which will be completed on October 14th, we will then set a ribbon cutting date
 - During the winter months, employees from the Parks Department collaborate with the Street Division to tackle snow removal. To enhance their skills and camaraderie, we organize a Snow ROAD.EO, which serves as a crucial training exercise combined with a friendly competition.

Angel Ferrara –

- Department Updates –
 - Updated the Park Board on Boston Daniels, the Park Board received an email about an ARPA meeting last Wednesday. Upon reviewing the Community Development Block Grant funds, it was discovered that those funds are no longer available due to specific timelines. We have been working with the Community Development team to gain a better understanding of the situation. Fortunately, we were able to obtain approval to use ARPA funds to replace the previously unavailable funds, rather than supplementing them. This was approved last Wednesday, which means the project is still fully funded. We are now moving forward with selecting contractors as the

project has already been put out for bids. We have a very tight timeline to encumber those funds by the end of the year.

- Kensington Park – Parks & Recreation celebrated some improvements with Community Development block grant dollars earlier this summer. We have brought this project in front of the Park Board, we are working on getting those project drawings for the bid manual done and completed, and we will then send them out for bids. We plan to put in soccer fields that will be fully fenced with a third-mile walking loop around the park and, hopefully, have lights installed, this depends on the budget, this project is fully funded through grants and federal dollars
- We have several projects that are being funded through ARPA, last Wednesday we did receive \$5000.000 for the new splash pad at Heathwood, unfortunately, we had to keep closed this past season due to maintenance issues, the investment will cost \$150.000, we were able to get approval from the Commission, along with an additional \$250.000 for the Eisenhower Community Center HVAC unit
- Shared and thanked all that came to the ribbon-cutting celebrations for the 2.1million dollars of investments this past August
- Shared a couple of videos of this celebration with the Park Board, one video was the new signage for Bridle Trail, which we celebrated this past Friday, the Park Foundation and several other organizations helped make this project happen.
- Angel Ferrara – Updated the Park Board about next month's Parks and Recreation meeting, staff will be attending the National Recreation and Park Association Conference in Atlanta asked how the Park Board would like the meeting held, as the Parks & Recreation will be on virtual for Park Board meeting, Park Board were all in agreement that some will be virtual and some will be in person for October Park Board meeting.

VI - BOARD MEMBER'S QUESTIONS OR COMMENT

- Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook – Asked if someone from Parks & Recreation could come to the Livable Neighborhoods meetings to represent Parks & Recreation and to bring the 2024 Parks recreation guides to share with the group
- Ashley Williamson – Shared with the Park Board that Community Capital Fund is hosting a Community Development Workshop series next week, and there are good opportunities to participate in the workshops, she also stated that a group she gathered and meant Karen Daniels at the soon-to-be Boston Daniels Park and heard the history that transpired

Mario Escobar -Chairman requested to adjourn; Dr. Jane Winkler Philbrook made a motion; Kevin Mitchell seconded the motion meeting was adjourned at 8:08 PM Motion.
